The subject of this book, Dorothea Lange's Migrant Mother, exists in more formats, prints, and places than (arguably) any other photograph in the world In this regard it is, ironically, singular Migrant Mother is also a singular icon of twentieth-century art Lange made this photograph—along with six others of the same woman, Florence Owens
