Fannie Lou Hamer & the Democratic Party

In spite of all that Fannie Lou Hamer had endured, she, like most of the women of the movement was not invited to the 1963 March on Washington In 1964, with the support of the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party (MFDP), Hamer ran for Congress The incumbent was a white man who had been elected to office twelve times
